WL: <sup>7</sup>Of the angels he says, "He makes his angels winds, and his ministers a flame of fire."


ALL: <sup>8</sup>But of the Son he says, "Your throne, O God, is forever and ever, the scepter of uprightness is the scepter of your kingdom.


















## The Lord's Prayer
