lowa Capitol Project. Once a month during the legislative session at the lowa House and Senate, Pastor Michael spends a morning at the Capitol meeting and praying with our state legislators. He makes a point to find our senator, Brad Zaun, our representative, John Forbes, and the House Majority Leader, Chris Hagenow, a friend of Westkirk. In addition, he will try to meet with other legislators who are struggling or need encouragement or prayer. Last week one legislator became emotional under the pressure of the collective bargaining debate. Another has come to repentance and faith. Michael has met with those working on the human trafficking issue - to thank them for their work; and also linked up folks in the Liberian church community with legislators who have an interest in the Liberian community here in Des Moines.

The Iowa Capitol Project lies at the heart of the Church Ambassa-dor Network - one of the non-political ministries of The Family Leader. The overall goal is to restore the biblical relationship between church and state, for throughout Scripture, God's kings and His Church are revealed in direct, though distinct, relationship. The Prophet Nathan and King David are excellent examples: Nathan was a friend to David, who invested in building a relationship with him, and when David stepped out of line, Nathan restored him. We see this relationship modeled with Elijah and Ahab, Daniel and Nebuchadnezzar, Joseph and Pharaoh, Jonah and the King of Nineveh, and so many more. It is a non-confrontational, non-partisan ministry of encouragement, prayer and evangelism.

Government's primary purpose is to commend good and punish evil, and yet government cannot determine good and evil on its own. That is why Pastor Michael and other ministers from around the State of Iowa travel to our Capitol throughout the spring to encourage and pray with our ministers in government. As missionaries in the civil arena, we know that government needs the Church to serve as its moral compass. Please consider purchasing the following items for House Damaris and the FAROS centers:

- Women's Clothes: Pajamas, warm weather, size XL (3 pairs) and size M (2 pairs). Cool weather, the same. Robes: size XL (3) and size M (2). Slippers: 5 pairs. Also, socks and underwear in various sizes.
- Body Lotions and Sprays: 8 oz. or smaller such as at Bath & Body Shop. Also, manicure products, hairbrushes, and combs.
- **Baby clothes:** Onesies and sleepers (<u>new, please</u>), neutral colors, sizes Newborn and up through 24 months. Other clothes: size 12-24 months.
- Boys' socks. Help us fill a whole suitcase with socks for unaccompanied boys at FAROS.
- **Hair clippers** (at least 3 sets). We'll teach the boys to use them and leave them there.
- **ESL flash cards.** Also, craft supplies (no overtly religious symbols, please).
- Candy! Hard candy only. No chocolate or gum.
