Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention and Awareness Month. On Thursday, January 16 at 11:00 a.m., Governor Reynolds will be signing the 2020 Proclamation declaring January as Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention and Awareness Month. All antitrafficking advocates and allies are encouraged to come to the rotunda of the State Capitol in Des Moines to participate as we recommit ourselves to eradicating this most heinous type of human exploitation. Following the proclamation signing, Governor Reynolds will present five Outstanding Anti-Trafficking Service Awards. Among the honorees is Westkirk's Rocky Vest - Founder and driving force behind Break The Cycle, an annual 200mile bike ride to raise funds to break the cycle of sex trafficking.
