How Does Westkirk Serve Communion? **During the first service**, the communion elements are served to the congregation by the Elders. We hold each of the elements and then when directed, partake together. As part of our communion tradition, we typically stand afterwards and

move toward the center aisle, placing our hand on the shoulder of the person next to us and, united together, sing the Lord's Prayer. This is one of the most meaningful moments of worship each month for many at Westkirk. **During the second service**, two pastors or Elders will hold the elements near the chancel area and when desired, worshippers come forward and are served individually.

November Communion Offering - Benevolence Fund. Four times a year our special Communion Sunday offering is designated for the Westkirk Benevolence Fund. The Benevolence Fund is a non-budgeted fund utilized for helping church members and folks from the community who need temporary assistance. Its only source of income is from special gifts such as yours.

Monies are approved by a member of the Pastoral Staff and a check is cut by the church treasurer. Approved funds go directly to pay for housing, utilities or medical bills. The benevolence fund can also supplement food dependence or fuel, but Westkirk contributes to and encourages the use of the Food Pantry system and is a partner with the Urbandale Police Department in providing gasoline.

Let Us All Rise in Heart or Body. At certain parts in our worship we stand and at other parts we sit. Most all of these movements are theologically intentional. We move bodily in the hope that our hearts would follow in that movement. When we sit we do so that we might humble our hearts in repentance or in submission. When we stand we do so that we might lift our hearts up to God to hear and respond to his call or simply to signify our bold assurance of his grace toward us in Jesus. As we consider these movements and our bodies in worship we also recognize that not all of our bodies work the same way. So we must add, that though we pray these bodily movements are helpful in shaping our worship before God they are not essential to worship God in this place. So, if you are unable to stand, or if hurts to do so, or if you have a little one on your lap; know that you are fully and faithfully worshipping here when through the Son, in the Spirit, you lift your heart up to God. Let us, together, lift our hearts up to the LORD in worship!
